


Icon of the Descent into Hades





Reflections on the present Scriptures: "The Lamb of God communicates with us on the holy and lightbearing night of Resurrection. We pray for this when we are just beginning to prepare for Lent, and afterwards many times during the course of the Great Fast: that the lord would vouchsafe us to partake of the Holy Mysteries on the night of Holy Pascha. At that time the grace of God acts in a special way upon men's hearts. We partake of the Christ Resurrected, we become partakers of His Resurrection. Of course, we must prepare ahead of time, and, having already communed during Great Lent, receive again the Holy Mysteries. Before Paschal Liturgy there is no time for a proper confession; this must be done earlier. And then, on that light-bearing night, having received general absolution, to draw near to the Divine Lamb, the pledge of our resurrection. No one should leave the church prematurely, rushing away to eat the meat of animals instead of receiving the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ."

St. Nicholas of Myra Byzantine Catholic Church News of interest, challenges, and thankfulness.



This week we received a considerate blessing with a most generous donation of \$3,000.00 with a note from the donor that said: "Hope the enclosed donation will help to encourage more donations for a better year financially. What do you think of the idea of using the enclosed donation as a matching gift to encourage larger weekly donations over the next couple of months? The goal for 2024 is to end the year on a more positive note as compared to 2023. "

He goes on to say that most of the expenses, like the parish he attends, are incurred in the first quarter with building insurance, diocesan assessments, and heat, which cannot be avoided. This gracious gift is very timely as he mentions heat. Just this week the heating system in the church had problems which shut off the heat in the living quarters. While we had immediate service the following morning and it was corrected, the costs incurred are assuredly of continued concern.

Our church is aging, and we are hoping the fund-raising events will offset much of the costs; however, it truly calls upon our hearts to love, protect and honor our beautiful unique St. Nicholas of Myra Byzantine Catholic Church.

Therefore, as he mentions "Challenge", the challenge goes forth. We already have received another donation marked "challenge" with a note saying they wish it could be a matching one. Can you step up to the challenge? Please mark your donation "challenge matching."

Celebrating Holy and Great Pascha

Brethren, how fine a thing it is to move from festival to festival, from prayer to prayer, from holy day to holy day. The time is now at hand when we enter on a new beginning: the proclamation of the blessed Passover, in which the Lord was sacrificed. We feed as on the food of life, we constantly refresh our souls with His precious blood, as from a fountain. Yet we are always thirsting, burning to be satisfied. But He Himself is present for those who thirst and in His goodness invites them to the feast day. Our Savior repeats His words: If anyone thirsts, let him come to me and drink.

He quenched the thirst not only of those who came to him then. Whenever anyone seeks him He is freely admitted to the presence of the Savior. The grace of the feast is not restricted to one occasion. Its rays of glory never set. It is always at hand to enlighten the mind of those who desire it. Its power is always there for those whose minds have been enlightened and who meditate day and night on the holy Scriptures, like the one who is called blessed in the holy psalm: Blessed is the man who has not followed the counsel

of the wicked, or stood where sinners stand, or sat in the seat of the scornful, but whose delight is in the law of the Lord, and who meditates on his law day and night.

Moreover, my friends, the God who first established this feast for us allows us to celebrate it each year. He who gave up His Son to death for our salvation, from the same motive gives us this feast, which is commemorated every year. This feast guides us through the trials that meet us in this world. God now gives us the joy of salvation that shines out from this feast, as He brings us together to form one assembly, uniting us all in spirit in every place, allowing us to pray together and to offer common thanksgiving, as is our duty on the feast. Such is the wonder of His love: He gathers to this feast those who are far apart, and brings together in unity of faith those who may be physically separated from each other.
